Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas Returns with 4th Edition Demonstrating the Vibrancy and Depth of the Taiwanese Art Market

Returning to full scale for the first time in three years, Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas has closed its fourth edition with ambitious presentations from 90 international galleries, robust sales, dynamic public programs as well as the launch of Young Patron Assembly in Taipei. The Fair welcomed local and international visitors to Taipei Nangang Exhibition Center from 12-14 May 2023, with VIP Preview and Vernissage on 11 May 2023, transforming the city into an exciting meeting point for the dialogue and exchange of art and ideas.

TAIPEI (15 May 2023) – Presented by UBS and organised by The Art Assembly, the fourth edition of Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas closed on 14 May 2023. Throughout the week, there was a resoundingly optimistic and positive atmosphere from the galleries, collectors and visitors to the fair, who came together to celebrate the city's rich and vibrant art scene. Returning to a full-scale iteration following the lifted travel restrictions worldwide, the Fair welcomed 34,145 visitors, including leading art museums and institutions as well as local and international collectors.

Closing to critical acclaim, Taipei Dangdai once again affirms its position as a leading regional art fair, and an important nexus for local and international contemporary art in East Asia. Collectors from around the globe gathered at the Fair for ambitious presentations by both established and emerging artists in the Galleries sector, a significant platform for galleries from Taiwan, Asia and around the world, Engage, a new sector for solo or duo presentations, and Edge, where collectors could discover the work of young and emerging artists.



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Robin Peckham, Taipei Dangdai Co-Director, said, "This year's Fair felt like a family reunion with the art world gathering in Taipei, including those who were not able to travel in recent years. There has been significant work achieved in establishing deeper roots for the fair within the Taiwanese community over the past few years, which is beginning to demonstrate how we can bring people together to generate moments of connection and exchange. We hope that everyone who came this year will take a piece of Taiwan home with them and begin to seed better visibility for Taiwanese artists in the years to come."

Magnus Renfrew, Taipei Dangdai Co-Founder and Co-Director, commented, "We have received such excellent feedback from the local community about the impressive quality of the presentations this year. The solid results demonstrate the strength and potential of the art market in Taiwan. We now have strong momentum and solid foundations on which to build for next year."

Strong sales reported across all sectors

The week saw robust sales across all sectors of the fair with works acquired by major collections and notable institutions at all levels of the market, including from international blue-chip galleries, sales of large-scale video installations as well as historical material from Asia and the West, sell-out booths including a solo presentation by Laurens Legiers at Gallery Vacancy, and reported sales of experimental media works such as Olaf Nicolai's installation in the Node sector with Galerie EIGEN + ART Leipzig/Berlin.

Events in the city during Taipei Dangdai

To run in tandem with the Fair, galleries, museums, and cultural institutions across Taipei hosted world-class exhibitions, and special events, providing international visitors with an exceptional program to discover the diverse vitality of the local art ecosystem. Local galleries and collectors were delighted to host international visitors, who were blown away by the positive steps the local art scene has made over the past few years.

A highlight of the week alongside Taipei Dangdai included an evening on 12 May jointly presented by Taipei Fine Arts Museum and Taipei Dangdai to celebrate two major solo exhibitions at the museum by Belgian artist David Claerbout and Taiwanese artist Kao Chung-Li, where international visitors were enthralled to see experiments in media art by a Taiwanese pioneer of the genre.

Additional highlights included the major solo show by Su Hui-Yu at MoCA Taipei where visitors could play a role in the production of a film being



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produced live at the exhibition; young media artists at Digital Art Center; the PhotoVogue party on 12 May hosted by Leslie Sun (APAC Editorial Director (Taiwan, India, Japan) Vogue) from the Fair's Advisory Group; and the Lightwell x 10680 exhibition celebrating in-depth collecting by young collectors from Taipei.

Notable visitors

The fair welcomed leading institutions and foundations, including Jun-Jieh Wang, Director of Taipei Fine Arts Museum; Huang Chien-Hung, Director of Kuandu Museum, Taipei; Frank Huang, the Chairman of Powerchip Foundation; Yulin Lee, Director of Kaohsiung Museum of Fine Arts; Patrick Sun, Founder of Sunpride Foundation; as well as government officials Shih Che, Minister of Ministry of Culture; Tsai Chia-Chun, Chairperson of Taiwan Creative Content Agency (TAICCA); and Tsai Shih-Ping, Commissioner of Department of Cultural Affairs, Taipei City Government. The Fair was also delighted to welcome notable collectors such as Maggie Tsai from Fubon Art Foundation, Ellie Lai, Chairman of Humble House Taipei, Wade Chang, Chairman of Coretronic Corp, Jenny Yeh from Winsing Art Foundation, Chairperson of the Taiwan Museum Friends Association Liu RuRong, Tai-Wei Chang, Alan Lo and Yenn Wong, Ivan Pun, and Jason Chi, alongside internationally renowned artists such as Takashi Murakami, Olaf Nicolai, Petah Coyne, Jin Meyerson, and more.

Artist **Olaf Nicolai** commented: "It's been impressive to see how engaging the audience are with the installation. They were captivated for sensory experiences as well as for the metaphysical contents." While artist **Petah Coyne** states: "I am delighted to return to Taiwan after a six-year absence. The North Star, presented at Taipei Dangdai, incorporates Taiwan's plentiful orchids as the creative elements. The visitors have demonstrated keen interest in the installation, generating enthusiastic and insightful discussions at the Ideas Forum, which moved me deeply. The unexpectedly constant flow of crowds on the VIP day was a remarkable sight to behold."

Ideas Forum

The Taipei Dangdai 2023 **Ideas Forum public talks programme** ran throughout the fair centered around the theme of 'The Extraterritorial'. Curated by **Co-Director Robin Peckham**, the programme featured **10 public talks** by key representatives in the Taipei and global art scene to share their work from the cutting edge of art today, touching on issues of region and cultural belonging. Speakers included: Billy Tang (Executive Director & Curator, Para Site, Hong Kong), Martin Germann (Adjunct Curator of Mori Art Museum), River Lin (Curator of Taipei Arts Festival, Taipei Performing Arts Centre), Sun A Moon (Director of Space AfroAsia) and Joey Tang (Director of KADIST San Francisco).

Participating artist and curator **Jo-ey Tang, Director of KADIST San Francisco** noted: "Taipei Dangdai's Ideas Forum brought together a wide range of strong curatorial voices from Taiwan, Asia and across the world. I was particularly impressed by the thematic programming and the generative



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conversations that will certainly reverberate beyond the art fair. The itinerary in Taipei organized by Taipei Dangdai provided me an invaluable insight into the vibrant ecology of Taipei's contemporary art scene, through exchanges with artists, curators, and directors of museums and art spaces. I look forward to continuing these dialogues and to returning to Taipei."

Young Patrons Assembly

First launched during ART SG in 2023, Taipei Dangdai hosted its first Young Patron Assembly, which acted as an international platform connecting a new generation of young patrons and collectors around the region, including from the Philippines, Japan, Myanmar, South Korea, Hong Kong and Taiwan. As part of the program, artist Chen Ching-Yuan, represented by TKG+, introduced his work to rapt attention among the visiting collectors.
