# Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas Officially Kicks-Off its 6th Edition with Hans Ulrich Obrist's "From World Soup to WORLDBUILDING" Lecture

The sixth edition of Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas, presented by UBS and organized by The Art Assembly, will take place at Taipei Nangang Exhibition Center from 9-11 May 2025 (with a VIP Preview and Vernissage on 8 May). This year's fair will showcase the best of global art today in the context of Taiwan's dynamic artistic landscape, bringing together world-class galleries, collectors, art professionals, and the public. Tickets are on sale now.

TAIPEI, 16 APRIL 2025: Marking the official kick-off of Taipei Dangdai's 2025 season, on 13 April, Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas invited Hans Ulrich Obrist, world-renowned curator and Serpentine Artistic Director, to deliver a free, open-to-the-public lecture that covered everything from how he has influenced the development of the curatorial profession to his current research interests in video games and artificial intelligence. The lecture was delivered to a full house at Taipei Fine Arts Museum with the support of Ming Wei Foundation and Artco. During his first-ever visit to Taiwan, Obrist visited Taipei's major public art museums and private foundations, met with dozens of emerging and established Taiwanese artists and architects, carried out in-depth interviews with pioneering figures, and learned firsthand about Taipei's extraordinary gallery community. "It's incredible to finally meet these pioneers in Taiwan who I have always been fascinated with, the filmmaker Tsai Ming-Liang and the artists Yuan Jai and Liu Kuo-sung. My research is always based on artists of previous generations but also seeing what younger artists are doing with AI and video game technologies and both have been very fruitful." said Obrist.

Looking ahead to the opening of Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas in May, the Fair is pleased to announce new highlights to the program as well as further details of some of the projects and sectors that have already been announced.

## **Taipei Dangdai Artist Highlights**

Taipei Dangdai consists of three core exhibition sectors. In the Galleries sector of the fair, which provides a significant platform for established galleries from Taiwan, Asia, and around the world, visitors will find the works of many of the masters of the twentieth century: the unparalleled still life painting of Giorgio Morandi, the abstract expressionism of Cy Twombly, and the feminism of Louise Bourgeois (all at Karsten Greve, B05); the pop art of Tom





Wesselmann and Kenny Scharf (both Almine Rech, B04), the Arte Povera of Michelangelo Pistoletto (Galleria Continua, A16), and the minimalism of Lee Ufan (SCAI THE BATHHOUSE, C04). Visitors can also explore the work of leading Asian artists who are shaping contemporary art on the global stage, including Chiharu Shiota (NF/NIEVES FERNÁNDEZ, C07), Refik Anadol (PILEVNELI, B08), Mariko Mori (SCAI THE BATHHOUSE, C04), and Anish Kapoor (Galleria Continua, A16).

Rising stars to look out for at the Fair include Felix Treadwell (DOPENESS ART LAB, A13), Aya Takano (Kaikai Kiki Gallery, B02), Andi Fischer (Sies + Höke, B06), Claire Tabouret, and Brian Calvin (both at Almine Rech, B04). And be sure not to miss the pride of Taiwan, those young and established artists from Taiwan whose work is lighting up the world stage: Steph Huang, Wu Chi-Tsung (both at gdm (Galerie du Monde), C05), Chen Chieh-Jen (Lin & Lin Gallery, A11), Yeh Tzu-Chi (Moon Gallery, B09, and Asia Art Center, A06), and Hsu Yung-Hsu (Art Space 3, A14). New for 2025, this year sees the addition of Embody, a special sector for galleries at the intersection of art, craft, and design. Standout artists include Genta Ishizuka, winner of the 2019 Loewe Foundation Craft Prize (ARTCOURT Gallery, C12), and Dahye Jeong, winner of the 2022 Loewe Foundation Craft Prize (Soluna Fine Art, C13).

## **Art around Taipei**

International visitors to Taiwan during Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas will be met with an unparalleled set of exhibitions to see beyond the Fair itself. Through the Fair's VIP Program, international collectors and professionals have access to a special shuttle bus that connects many of these leading venues. ## **YPA (Young Patrons Assembly)**

Since 2023, Taipei Dangdai has organized the Young Patron Assembly, an initiative that encourages emerging collectors and enthusiasts to network and share information with their peers from across the core Asian regions. This has taken several forms: in 2023 YPA invited artists Chen Ching-Yuan and Alvin Ong to introduce their work to the group, while last year in 2024 artist Wu Mei-Chi led an interactive session for members. In 2025, YPA will host an exhibition in a dedicated lounge area of Taipei Dangdai. Taiwan-based YPA members have been invited to loan recent acquisitions from their collections that represent their approach to contemporary art, giving visitors a chance to see where art in Taiwan is headed. Collectors who have confirmed their participation include Francise Chang, Tai-Wei Chang, Ivette Chiang, Bryant Chao, Albert Chow, Yuyu Chen, Kenny Chen, Rob Huang, YuChen Huang, Alan Li, Vincent Lo, Louis Liu, Matthew Shieh, Peiwei Tseng, Kelt Tobunluepop, Sophie Wang, Lee Yu, Vincent Yen, contributing the work of artists from George Condo to Roman Ondak.

## **Cultural Partners**

Taipei Dangdai this year sees the return of the popular Cultural Partners sector, offering Taiwan's leading private foundations and institutions a venue to share their important work with the public and celebrate the camaraderie of coming together over art and culture. Participants this year include the CTBC Foundation for Arts and Culture, which will present three female artists—Rebecca Baumann, Wu Yi-Han, and Hsiao Pei-Yi—from their collection, and, for the first time, King Car Cultural & Art Center with a solo exhibition by emerging





artist Chuang Pei-Xin, in keeping with the Center's ongoing commitment to supporting early-career artists in Taiwan. New images of these projects are included with this release.

## **Professional Day**

For the first time in 2025, the Friday of Taipei Dangdai, 9 May, has been designated as Professional Day, a time for curators, museum leaders, arts administrators, art writers, and other art professionals to network among themselves and connect with the international gallery community. The program will kick off with a Brunch Reception within the Fair to which curators and other cultural workers from Taiwan's museums, institutions, and publications are invited. This will be followed by a ceremony awarding the inaugural Edge Artist Award, a panel conversation on "The State of the Asian Biennial," and a special update from the curators of the forthcoming Taipei Biennial, all held in the Ideas Forum. Taipei Dangdai looks forward to the professional members of Taiwan's art industry joining these key moments of cultural exchange with international guests.

#### **Ideas Forum**

Taipei Dangdai Art & Ideas is uniquely focused in equal parts on the market for art and the ideas behind it. In 2025, the Ideas Forum series of talks and panels alongside the art fair takes on the big question of how we connect across cultures and across polities in an era of polarization and suspicion. Titled "Braided Strands of Fate," the Forum invites important curators and other art thinkers to share their practices and ideas of weaving together geographies, spiritualities, and materialities. One panel will evaluate "The State of the Asian Biennial," inviting the curators of recent and upcoming landmark exhibitions to publicize their research. Confirmed speakers include Nicolas Bourriaud, Artistic Director of the 2024 Gwangju Biennale; Philippe Pirotte and Vera Mey, curators of the 2024 Busan Biennale; and Sam Bardaouil and Till Fellrath, curators of the 2025 Taipei Biennale. Two panels will look at the materiality of art's circulation, one asking questions about digital art and its economies, the other proposing radical new modalities of the relationship between art, craft, and design as seen in the Fair's new Embody sector. In "Digital Art and its Markets," artists Su Hui-Yu, Zhang Xu Zhan, Cheang Shu Lea and Shavonne Wang join curator Shao-An Huang. In "Crafting Futures," curator Nicolas Tremblay and Yoko Choy will be in dialogue with Chen Tien-Li, Director of National Taiwan Craft Research and Development Institute. Receptions for VIP guests to these two panels will be held in the Fair, offering exclusive tours of the relevant sectors and exhibitions. Finally, in collaboration with the Indigenous Peoples Cultural Development Center, two panels on "Global Indigeneity" and "Indigenous Art at the Global Biennials" will bring together curators Patrick Flores, X Zhu-Nowell, and Eva Lin with artist Etan Pavavalung.





Registration has now opened for all panels of the Ideas Forum. Visitors may register in advance at <a href="www.taipeidangdai.com">www.taipeidangdai.com</a> to reserve seats. All talks are free and open to the public. Simultaneous translation will be provided in English and Chinese.

## **Special Exhibitions**

Extending their collaboration for a second year, Taipei Dangdai and the Ministry of Culture co-host a special exhibition of work by Taiwanese artists. Titled "Pulling the Plug," the exhibition includes three large-scale digital installations by artists working at the cutting edge of technology and contemporary culture. Shu Lea Cheang, the legendary new media artist based in Paris, presents a digital moving image installation featuring an ever-morphing self portrait challenging AI algorithm. Su Hui-Yu works with digital collective XTRUX, combining open-source AI tools with traditional film production in a sly reinterpretation of the military propaganda that sits within media culture. Finally, Zhang Xu Zhan, who comes from a family of traditional paper artisans, works in stop motion animation to tell a story of termites that shift their dietary habits to consume artificial cables after sudden ecological changes due to climate. Taken together, these three works give a sense of the shock and urgency with which technology appears in our culture today. New images of all of these projects are included with this release.

Meanwhile, this year marks the launch of Taipei Node, a new annual special exhibition that celebrates a Taipei-based artist of global promise. For the first edition this year, titled "Making of…Li Yi-Fan 李亦凡", artist Li Yi-Fan will present a mini-retrospective of three works that span themes from digital technology and online information to artificial intelligence. Li has been chosen to represent Taiwan at the 2026 Venice Biennale, making this exhibition a valuable sneak preview of that much-awaited pavilion. He was awarded the eighth Tung Chung Prize by the Hong Foundation in 2024, and is a resident of the prestigious Rijksakademie with the support of the Foundation. Taipei Node is co-hosted with the Hong Foundation and sponsored by the Department of Cultural Affairs, Taipei City Government. New images of this project are included with this release.

## **Edge Artist Award**

For the first time in 2025, a prize will be awarded to an outstanding artist participating in the Edge sector, which is open to galleries showing new bodies of work of one to two young or emerging artists. An international jury consisting of leading curators and thinkers will meet at Taipei Dangdai to carefully review the work of all artists exhibiting in the Edge sector, and will award the winning artist at a ceremony on Friday 9 May 2025. The winning artist will





receive a prize of USD 10,000 as well as recognition at the Fair. Jurors for 2025 include Lai Hsiang-Ling (Director, New Taipei City Art Museum), Lee Yulin (Director, Asia University Museum of Modern Art), Stefano Rabolli Pansera (Founding Director, Bangkok Kunsthalle & Khao Yai Art Forest), Mark Rappolt (Editor-in-Chief, ArtReview & ArtReview Asia), and X Zhu-Nowell (Executive Director & Chief Curator, Rockbund Art Museum). According to Rabolli Pansera, "It is a true honour to be part of the jury for Taipei Dangdai, a leading platform that highlights the dynamism of contemporary art in Asia. The region is producing some of the most inspiring ideas today and stands as a powerful laboratory of new aesthetics shaping the global art scene."
